# Call Me




### Activity 1: The Cover

You've probably heard people use the phrase 'don't judge a book by its cover', when they mean that you shouldn't judge something or someone by their appearance.

However, a book cover can give us lots of clues about the story it holds.

Take a look at the cover of *Call Me Lion* and then answer the following questions:



How does the cover make you feel?	
What time of year do you think it is set?	
What do you think the story might be about?	
If you were writing the opening line, what would it be?	

## Activity 2: The Opening

The opening of a book is very important to set the reader's expectations. Which of these tasks do you think are the most important for starting a book? Try putting the tasks in order from most to least important:

ntroduce the main character(s)
Show what the difficulty or problem that the main character is facing
Set the tone of the book
Hook or entice the reader to keep reading
Entertain the reader
Start the story
Place the story into the setting (both time and place)

Read the opening of *Call Me Lion* and see if you can give examples of how the chapter uses these devices to set up the story.



**Extension task:** Have a go at rewriting the opening paragraphs for *Call Me Lion* based on what you think the most important devices are for starting a book.

### Activity 3: Picture This

When we're reading we all imagine characters differently. Were the illustrations of Leo, Richa and Patch in the book how you imagined them?


### Pick one and draw your interpretation of them in the space below.

Here are some descriptions from the book to help you:

**Richa:** grinning face; long, black hair; long, thin arms that waggle about and are streaked with sun cream; bare feet.

**Leo:** aged ten; hair that puffs up high like a dandelion clock; hair like a lion's mane; good at dancing.

**Patch:** waggy tail; brown and white with a big black patch over his right eye and ear; dog-pirate; hairy.




There are other characters in the book that are not illustrated.

Read how Leo describes his siblings, Brianne and Ryan, and have a go

at drawing what you think they would look like:

I have a big brother called Ryan who is seventeen and sprays stuff all over his body that makes the back of my throat do dry. Brianne is my sister: she is sixteen and wears floaty skirts and scarves and wants to be a physicist. Brianne and Ryan argue all the time.



### Activity 4: Letter About Me

In the story Leo writes Richa a letter to explain why he can't talk. It takes him a long time to get it to sound the way he wants to and he worries a lot about what Richa might think. If you were writing a letter to a new friend all about you what would you want them to know? Would you write about your family and other friends? What about the things you like to do or your favourite foods? Would you tell them the good as well as the bad things about you? **Try writing that letter now.** 

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### Activity 5: Feelings Map

Call Me Lion is written in the first person, which means it's told from the point of view of the main character. This means we get to read how Leo is feeling throughout the story.

We know that Leo worries when his letter is delivered to Richa, but what about the other emotions he experiences throughout the story? Take a look at the table below and try to match the feelings Leo experiences to the events that happen in the book.

Emotion	Event in the Book
Fear	In chapter three when Leo's sister Brianne makes different suggestions of games they can play. Clue: Feeling my face heat up, I look at Patch who is sitting on Richa's feet having his ear tickled.
Joy	In chapter three when Leo remembers the conversation he overheard between Scarlett and Tiffany. Clue: I couldn't stop listening even though it was causing me actual, physical pain.
Embarrassment	In chapter seven when Richa choses to stick with Leo instead of dancing with the girls. Clue: I don't know why she does, or how she has landed here, but I am totally grateful for her.
Gratitude	In chapter thirteen when Richa wants Leo to perform the dress-rehearsal of their dance routine. Clue: I want to run in the opposite direction but I can t move.
Shame	In chapter seventeen when Richa is waiting on the front doorstep for Leo to get home. Clue: I'm so happy she's there I almost rush over towards her.

### **Extension Activity:**

Can you find any other emotions in the story? Make a list of them and describe what Leo is doing or thinking when he experiences them.

### Activity 6: Newspaper Article

Read the second half of Chapter 19 when Richa and Leo perform their dance routine.

The Daily Just Jive are looking for a newspaper article about the dance. Can you write one? Think of an eye-catching headline and remember to stress to the reader why the dance is such a special moment. Include an eyewitness quote to add extra detail to the story!


To complete the article, create a picture of the dance and write a caption too.
